**Reading.**

Listen to the story of 'The very hungry caterpillar'. Read the book with your grown up if you have it or listen to the story on You Tube.

What is your favourite part of the story?

Tell your grown up what happened to the very hungry caterpillar.

What do you think caterpillars should really eat?

**Can you help prepare a fruit salad?**

What will you use?

How will you make it?



**Writing.**

Can you make a picture book of the very hungry caterpillar?

What happened first, next and at the end? Use the story sequence attached to help you.

Practise writing your name on your book. You are the author!

### Listening games and phonics.

Take it in turns to record you and then your child retelling the story of 'The very hungry caterpillar'.

Listen to the recordings together.

Play 'I spy with my little eye, something beginning with....' Use a variety to fruit to play the game; banana, apple, pear, orange etc.

### Maths.

**Mathletics!** Roll a dice (or ask your grown up to help you write numbers 1 to 6 on pieces of paper so you can pick a number.) What number is it? Can you do that number of hops, jumps, claps, stamps or star jumps?

Open a packet of raisins, carrot sticks or apple pieces. Count out how many you have. Eat one! How many are left? Keep eating and counting!

### Creative fun!

Make a cucumber caterpillar.



Use an old sock to make a caterpillar puppet. Put on a puppet show!
