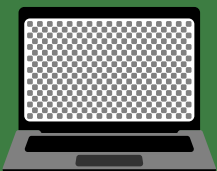
# SEND COFFEE MORNING

Our first ever TCS Mini London Marathon took place in school! A memorable day and thoroughly enjoyed by everyone. Firstly, the children experienced an opening and warm-up ceremony. Then each class took it in turns to walk, run or jog 25 laps around our marked heart line, which is equal to 2 miles! Afterwards, we celebrated by having a closing ceremony. All the children received a certificate and an ice pole. Finally, we announced the medallist winners from each class.

All our children shared our values - Kindness by supporting each other, Resilience by persevering throughout the marathon, Respect by showing superb sportsmanship. Finally, Responsibility for understanding the importance of being active and how this is also good for our wellbeing.

We also announced the children who raised the most of amount of money and had joint sibling winners too. We truly were not expecting this amount of money. All the money raised will go towards investing in further sports and PE equipment alongside some of our End of term Summer events.

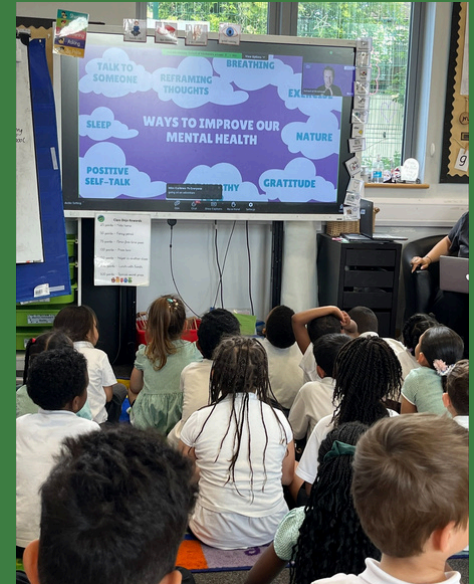
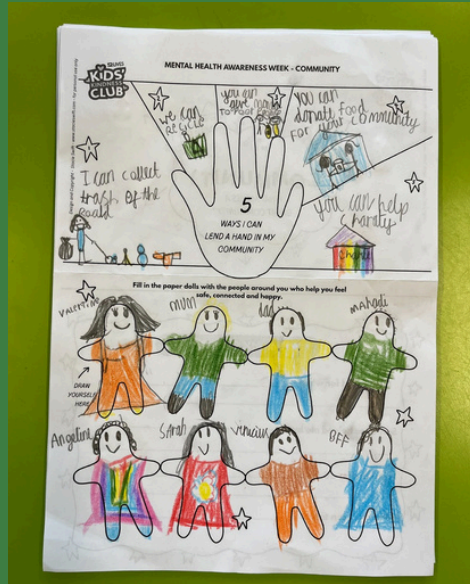
# VE DAY CELEBRATIONS

Once again, we have ensured that we continue to provide an enriching educational experience for our children that was memorable and valuable for all.

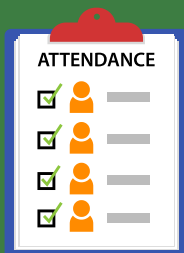


# WHOLE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE
