

Dear Parents and Carers

As we reach the end of the academic year, it is time to reflect on what our wonderful school has accomplished this year. We are truly proud of how far we have come along with our school improvement journey. As you are all aware, this was all validated when the school had an Ofsted Inspection (March 2025). We were absolutely delighted that the school was awarded an Outstanding judgement in all areas! We have continued to provide a highly ambition curriculum for all pupils, a highly aspirational personal development programme and where pupils' behaviour is exemplary.

We have also had many successful parent/ carer events that have bought the whole school community together such as the Reading Fiesta, class assemblies, Mental Health and SEND Coffee mornings, Mother's and Father's day Stay and Play, French day, Whole School Poetry Performances, Art Exhibition and not forgetting our Mini Olympics and Sports Day!

This year, we have also increased our cultural capital offer by enriching our children on educational visits, art galleries, museums and workshops. Alongside, providing weekly music lessons such as Songsack, Ukulele and Steel pans during multicultural and worldview day. We will continue to build on this even further next academic year.

The Summer term was rather busy with many statutory assessments. Again, we are incredibly proud of our children's achievements. Here are the following headlines:

- **Early Years:** 80% of pupils achieving a Good Level of Development. The National average is estimated at 69%
- **Year 1:** 80% of pupils passed the Phonics Screening Check. This is in line with National average estimated at 80%
- **Year 4:** 55% of pupils scoring full marks in the Multiplication Tables Check. The National average is estimated at 38%
- **Year 6:** 67% KS2 Reading, Writing and Maths Combined. This is above the National average, which is at 62%
 - 67% of pupils achieving the expected standard in Reading
 - 67% of pupils achieving the expected standard in Writing
 - 78% of pupils achieving the expected standard in Maths and 11% of pupils achieving the higher standard

We are either working in line or above national average in all statutory assessments, which is a great achievement in itself.

We would also like to thank our incredibly dedicated and hard working Delta staff team, who really do go over and beyond and ensure our wonderful Delta children are at the heart of everything we do. They have all continued to set high expectations, our Delta Values and Kindness, instil positive learning behaviours to ensure your children are well rounded citizens for the future and have the best possible outcomes.

A heartfelt thank you to all our parent/carers and families who helped with the fundraising for the TCS Mini London Marathon in school that took place on 2nd May 2025. All the fundraising money has been used for our Delta children, such as buying more playground equipment, the outdoor speaker, all the new equipment for Sports Day, costumes for the Living History Museum and our Delta Carnival. We have finally received our sustainable wooden trophy for participating in the event too!



Finally, We wish you a wonderful Summer holiday and look forward to seeing our Delta children, including our new Reception cohort, on Wednesday 3rd September at 8.45am.

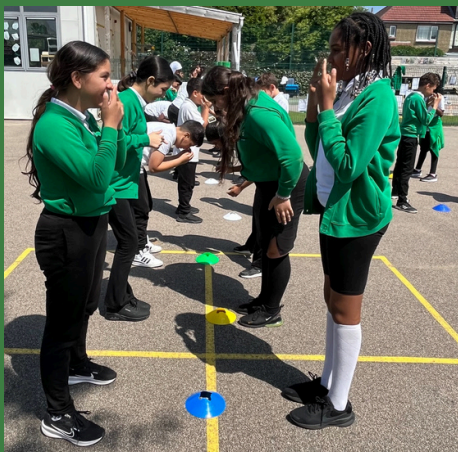
CONNECT TOURNAMENTS

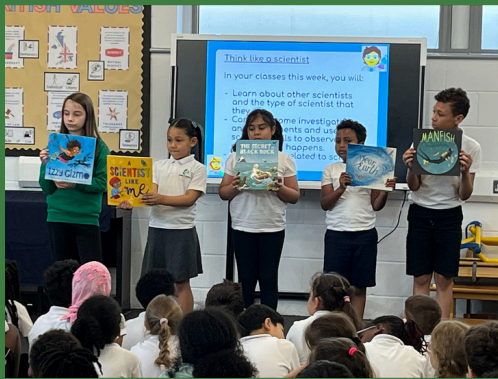
SPORTS2INSPIRE

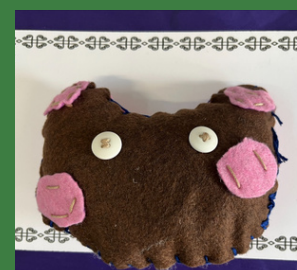
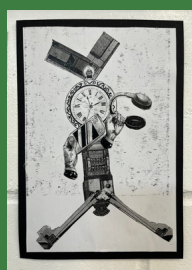
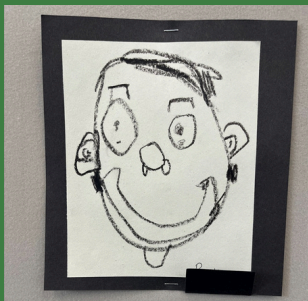
WHOLE SCHOOL POETRY PERFORMANCE

DELTA CARNIVAL

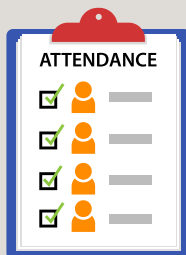

SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDER

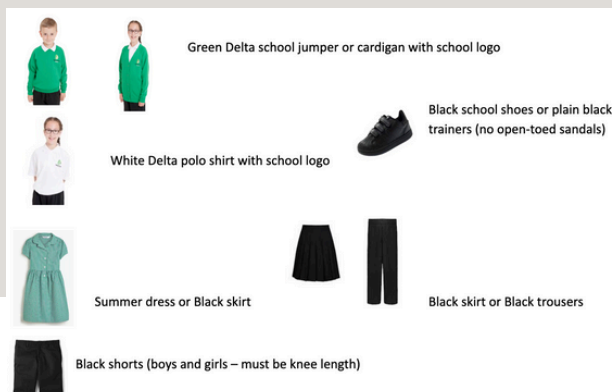
