

### Dear Parents and Carers

As we approach the end of the academic year, it is time to reflect and showcase that kindness is our superpower, and we are proud to be a small nurturing community with high expectations for all. The achievement and wellbeing of all the children is at the heart of everything we do. Once again, we have instilled strong foundations by inspiring curiosity, embracing diversity and creating opportunities for remarkable futures.

Sports, drama, music alongside our personal development and cultural capital offer, have provided opportunities to simply enjoy time together and being kind, which all play an important role at Delta. These experiences help our wonderful Delta children to develop confidence, resilience, teamwork, kindness and friendships, whilst creating memories that will stay with them long after they leave our school.

The Summer term was rather busy with many statutory assessments. We are incredibly proud of all our children's achievements, and with these phenomenal results! Here are the following headlines:

- **Early Years:** 80% of pupils achieving a Good Level of Development. This is above the estimated National average of 72%
- **Year 1:** 92% of pupils passed the Phonics Screening Check. This is above the estimated National average of 82%
- **Year 4:** 61% of pupils scoring full marks in the Multiplication Tables Check. This is above the estimated National average of 44%
- **Year 6:** 72% KS2 Reading, Writing and Maths Combined. This is above the National average, which is at 63%
  - 78% of pupils achieving the expected standard in Reading. This is above the National average, which is 75%
  - 72% of pupils achieving the expected standard in Writing. This is in line with the National average of 73%.
  - 78% of pupils achieving the expected standard in Maths. This is above National average of 75%.

Overall, we are working above national average in all statutory assessments, which is a great achievement in itself. We also achieved:

- 39% pupils working at a higher standard in Reading
- 17% of pupils working at a higher standard in Writing
- 44% of pupils working at a higher standard in Maths

We would like to thank all our wonderful Delta staff, who have continued to show their dedication and commitment to the school. A fond farewell to Victoria, Mahadi and James, who have decided it is the right time for them to take the next step in their careers. We also have to say goodbye to Abbey and Lucy, who have been teaching the current Year 1/2 Mandela from the start of the Spring term. Abbey is returning back to live in Australia, and Lucy is pursuing a career outside teaching. I'm sure you will join the school in thanking and wishing them all the very best of luck!

Finally, we would also like to express a heartfelt thank you to all our wonderful Delta children and families. It has been an incredible privilege, and our absolute honour to lead, manage, and serve this very special school community. We are immensely proud of the journey we have been on together. Our collective goal has always been to provide an Outstanding education for all our Delta children, and we are so pleased with the continued progress we have made towards that vision. This achievement is a testament to the dedication of our staff, to the hard work of our children, and the fantastic support we receive from you, our Delta families. Thank you! We know we are leaving our lasting legacy but wish David Wilson (new Executive Headteacher), Flora Georgiou (new Head of School) and the new members of the Delta team the very best of luck!

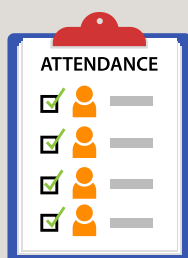
## SCHOOL GAMES - SILVER
